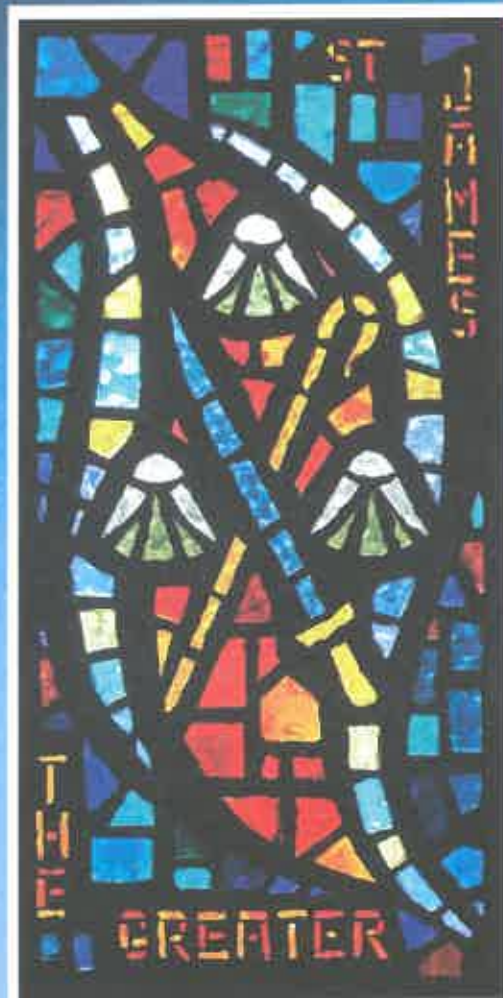
INFANT BAPTISMS – The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd Sunday of each month at the noon Mass and on the 4th Sunday of each month at 1:30 p.m. (outside of Mass). Parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Program, preferably 2 months prior to the birth of the child. The program is held on the 2nd THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH in the Seniors' Room of the Parish Center at 7:00 p.m. Godparents are also encouraged to attend. Please pre-register by calling the Parish Office. Baptisms will be scheduled after attending the program.

NEW PARISHIONERS – Please register in person at the Parish Office as soon as possible.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS – Please notify the Parish Office if you have had a change of address or phone number, or if a member of your family has gone into a nursing facility or moved out of the household.

BEQUESTS – A bequest to your parish is a way to honor your church and faith of your lifetime. A bequest, included in your will, is exempt from estate and inheritance taxes, and reduces the amount of the estate to be taxed. For more information, please call the Parish Office.

St. James 175th Anniversary



St. James White Oak 175th Anniversary
1843 - 2018—Spreading the Word



Because of many requests from parishioners, a booklet is being printed with the 175 Facts that have been in the bulletin during the past year. These will be available after Mass on **November 24 & 25**. **While the printing costs are underwritten by generous parishioners, we are asking that, if you take one, you give a small donation.** The money raised will be used to help the St. Vincent de Paul Society meet the requests they receive after the holidays. Their funds are always depleted for Christmas and it is sometimes hard for them to offer help after the holidays until the next 5th Sunday collection. Helping others is also a fitting way for us to close our celebration.

For the next few bulletins we will spotlight some of our parish groups.

Spirituality

168. Family Ministries:

FAMILIA - Familia is a Catholic program committed to strengthening all families by helping men and women live their vocation to marriage and parenthood in all its fullness. Familia began about five years ago at St. James. The program is part of Cana Family Institute, and it's being renamed Cana Family this year. The four-year program follows encyclicals from Pope John Paul II, which is devoted to the family. There were 2-3 groups that went through the four-year program when it started. This year, we have two new groups that have formed. One group meets at St. James and has about 13 members. Another group meets at St. Antoninus and has about 8 members.

Father's Ministry - The Father's Ministry was started in 1989, with a membership of 20 men. We currently have over 65 members in our group, and throughout the 29 years, there have been over 200 men who have participated. The purpose of the Father's ministry is to help Fathers develop a closer relationship with God, their wives, their children and others. Members and their families volunteer at the East Walnut Hills Soup Kitchen one Saturday every other month and serve breakfast to over 150 people. For over 15 years, we have been donating Thanksgiving baskets to families that are struggling. We are currently planning on distributing over 140 baskets this year. St. James Father's raise the necessary funds to support both of these outreach programs through past and present members. The Thursday before Christmas, a group of over 100 fathers, wives, and children sing Christmas Carols to residents at Our Lady of the Woods, and at least two other households that are struggling during the Holiday Season. This is a tradition that has been occurring for the past 18 years.

MOMS (Ministry of the Mothers Sharing) - The group was formed at St. James over twenty years ago. It is a group of mothers searching for spiritual growth and development through Christian fellowship, religious support, spiritual introspection, spiritual discussions and prayer. By sharing ideas and values, it is our greatest hope to integrate God's plan into daily lives by raising our children and supporting each other in the many roles as mothers and friends. MOMS ministry meets twice a month.

169. St. James LIFE: (Life Is For Everyone) - St. James LIFE Ministry began nine years ago. It promotes respect and protection for life at all stages, from conception to natural death. Our objective is to impact our parish families and our community through prayer, guided by the power of the Holy Spirit; by being a source of education on Church teaching on the respect for human life; and through action by hosting or participating in events that demonstrate that St. James is a "pro-life" parish. Some of the ways L.I.F.E. Ministry does this are: Lights for Life luminary display, 40 Days for Life, Mother's Day Flower Sale, Archdiocese Respect Life Campaign, Life Garden, Memorial Bench for the Unborn in the Life Garden, PCW Baby Bottle Campaign, PCW Baby Shower, Models of the Unborn for school science lab, Advent calendar sale, Cemetery of Innocents white cross display, January Life Poster display, and the Fortnight for Freedom/4th of July public Rosary. St. James L.I.F.E. Ministry meetings are usually held the first Monday of the month.

170. St. Mary's Ladies Society: Our group was founded in 1847 and had 25 members. Currently, there are 108 members. The Ladies Society has always paid to have the church linens cleaned, and some members make baptismal garments for infants. We also give two \$500 scholarships to St. James School; one to a boy and one to a girl. We have an annual raffle of an American Girl Doll with several homemade clothes, and a sports basket to support this. All women of the parish are invited to pray and share fellowship at our monthly meetings.

171. Shepherds of Christ - This ministry was begun at St. James in 1997. There are 8-12 members, who pray during the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for priests, renewal of the Church and the world. This includes praying for our parish, the pope, vocations and all religious orders. We meet in Church every Monday at 11:00 a.m. to pray the Rosary and Shepherds of Christ Prayer Manual. We make rosaries and have special programs for schools, nursing homes and shut-ins. We help in preparing Priestly Newsletters to mail to Bishops and Priests throughout the world.

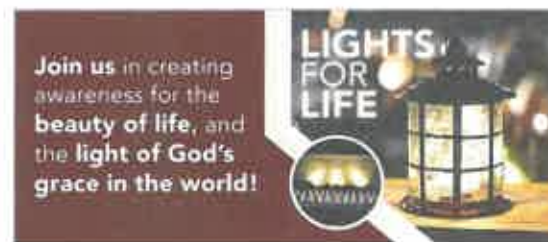

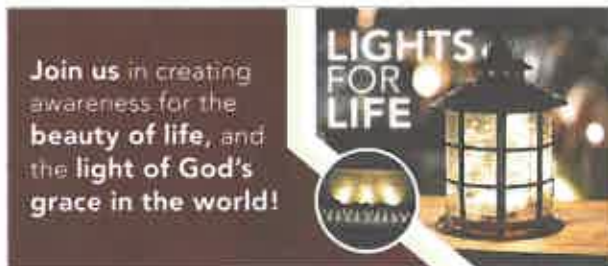
