MARRIAGES – Arrangements should be made through the Parish Office at least six months before any other planning. Pre-Cana Conference, FOCCUS, Engaged Encounter or Equivalent programs are required.

INFANT BAPTISMS – The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd Sunday of each month at the noon Mass and on the 4th Sunday of each month at 1:30 p.m. (outside of Mass). Parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Program, preferably 2 months prior to the birth of the child. The program is held on the 2nd THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH in the Seniors' Room of the Parish Center at 7:00 p.m. Godparents are also encouraged to attend. Please pre-register by calling the Parish Office. Baptisms will be scheduled after attending the program.

NEW PARISHIONERS – Please register in person at the Parish Office as soon as possible.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS – Please notify the Parish Office if you have had a change of address or phone number, or if a member of your family has gone into a nursing facility or moved out of the household.

BEQUESTS – A bequest to your parish is a way to honor your church and faith of your lifetime. A bequest, included in your will, is exempt from estate and inheritance taxes, and reduces the amount of the estate to be taxed. For more information, please call the Parish Office.

St. James 175th Anniversary



St. James White Oak 175th Anniversary 1843 - 2018—Spreading the Word



Because of many requests from parishioners, a booklet is being printed with the 175 Facts that have been in the bulletin during the past year. These will be available after Mass **this WEEKEND and next weekend, December 1/2. While the printing costs are underwritten by generous parishioners, we are asking that, if you take one, you give a small donation. The money raised will be used to help the St. Vincent de Paul Society meet the requests they receive after the holidays.** Their funds are always depleted for Christmas and it is sometimes hard for them to offer help after the holidays until the next 5th Sunday collection. Helping others is also a fitting way for us to close our celebration.

Spirituality

172. Grief Support Group - Four years ago, St. James began a grief support ministry. Twice a year, we offer an eight-week program, open to anyone grieving the loss of a loved one. Topics covered over the eight-weeks are: denial, anger, guilt, depression, powerlessness, what our faith teaches about death, and finally, acceptance. Our intent is to provide an opportunity to be with others who can relate to what a grieved individual is feeling, gaining an understanding of the grief process, with a goal of fostering healing and peace.

173. Bereavement Ministry – The Bereavement Ministry has been active at St. James for over thirty years. Members provide prayer, comfort and timely support to grieving parishioners who have experienced the death of a loved one. Volunteers extend assistance to the families with the preparation of the vigil, funeral liturgy and final committal. The care continues after the death with special attention to each person's grief. There are 36 members.

174. Music Ministry – The Saint James Music Ministry consists of various groups including Children's Choir (grades four through six), Youth Choir (grades seven through twelve), Youth Bell Choir (grades six through eight), Adult Choir, Music Ensemble, and Cantor Ministry, with a total of about 75 people. Rehearsals are usually held every other week. Each group usually sings at the 4:30 Saturday and 10:00 Sunday Masses on a rotating basis (the Youth Bell Choir plays at the Wednesday school Mass). We welcome new members any time.

175. St. James Parish, Then and Now:

- The first baptism at St. James Church was on August 6, 1944. Up to 1943, there were over 3,600 baptisms. From 1943 to the end of 2017, there were 7,837 baptisms.
- The first marriage at St. James Church was on January 1, 1845. Up to 1943, there were over 700 marriages. From 1943-2017, there were 1,932 marriages.
- The first funeral at St. James was on July 10, 1847. Up to 1943, there were more than 1,000 funerals. From 1943-2017, there were 2,987 funerals.
- In 1873, there were 93 families with children in St. James School, and the tuition was fifty cents per month, per child. In 2018, there are 380 families at St. James School, and the tuition is \$3,888 for one child.
- In 1943, there were 24 8th grade graduates. In 2018, there are 69 8th grade students.
- In 1943, there were 38 First Communicants. In 2018, there were 51 First Communicants.
- In 1907, there were 175 families in the parish. In 1943, there were 332 families in the parish. Today, there are 1734 registered households.
- The oldest member in 1943 was 94. Today, the oldest member is 99.

I know that many parishioners have found these 175 Facts about the parish very interesting. What I have learned is that there is always more history of our parish to be uncovered. A family memory that has been shared for generations sometimes leads to the discovery of an interesting event or phase in the parish that wasn't previously known. And of course, the Facts have spurred many personal memories.

The numbers in Fact 175 are sacramental moments, times when Jesus Christ has touched the lives of his people, touched our lives in this parish. This parish was founded by those early families so that the sacraments could be celebrated in their neighborhood. These numbers are a fitting close to our Facts because they tell us how the intention of those early settlers was fulfilled. They also remind us that the celebration of Christ's actions in the sacraments has been, and will always be, the core and center of our parish.

Tuition Assistance Donations

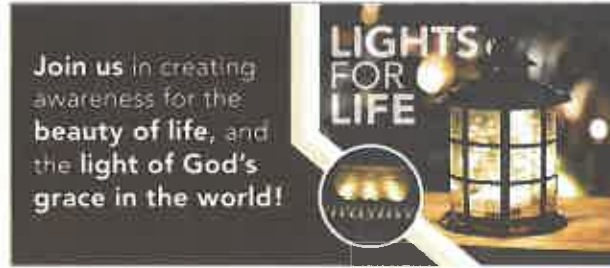

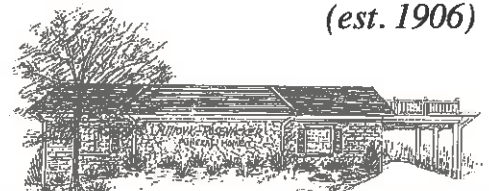
