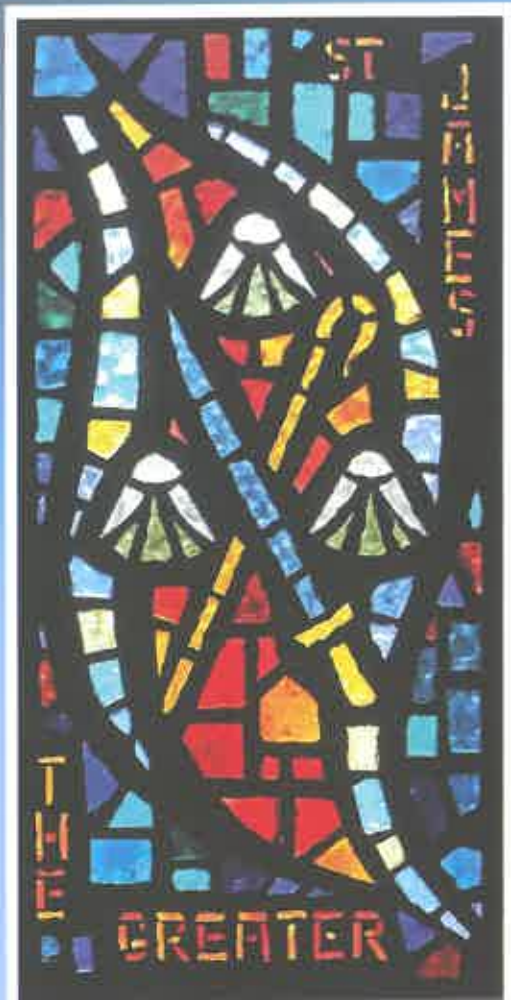

Parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Program, preferably 2 months prior to the birth of the child. The program is held on the 2nd THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH in the Seniors' Room of the Parish Center at 7:00 p.m. Godparents are also encouraged to attend. Please pre-register by calling the Parish Office. Baptisms will be scheduled after attending the program.

NEW PARISHIONERS – Please register in person at the Parish Office as soon as possible.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS – Please notify the Parish Office if you have had a change of address or phone number, or if a member of your family has gone into a nursing facility or moved out of the household.

Good Friday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat and meat products. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onward.

Calling All Catholics! Could This Be Our Last Hope of Salvation?

The ills of our world affect each and every one of us and are caused by sin and the casting out of God's 10 Commandments. The signs of the coming of the Lord are all around us. A modern-day prophet, who has recently been made a saint in the Catholic Church, has been telling us that Jesus is about to return to judge the world. Her name is **Saint Faustina**. Jesus appeared to her in 1931, and He told her that she was going to prepare the world for His Second Coming. She spent the next 7 years recording the words of Jesus, which have been published worldwide in her diary "Divine Mercy in My Soul." The Catholic Church has determined that what she wrote in that book is true. Jesus told Faustina that He would be coming soon and that **He was going to pour out His mercy before He comes**. He would be pouring it out, **like a whole ocean**, on a Feast that He wanted to be celebrated in His Church. St. Pope John Paul II instituted this **Feast of Divine Mercy** which is celebrated each year on the **first Sunday after Easter** and is called **Divine Mercy Sunday**. You can call the parish office to check on your status. **If you were previously approved with BCI fingerprints ONLY and have not completed the Selection.com background check, PLEASE call the**

parish office to see when they expire. Fingerprints for Volunteers are no longer required, BUT if you were approved with fingerprints ONLY when they become 5 years old, or by December 31, 2018, EVERYONE will NEED to complete the Selection.com background check through their VIRTUS account (cost is \$25). **This is a one-time requirement.** Log into your account, click on the Toolbox tab and the Selection.com background check will be on the left side of the screen. Click and follow the instructions. **New volunteers must attend a VIRTUS workshop and complete the Selection.com background check through your VIRTUS account prior to volunteering or coaching.** ONCE COMPLETED, BE SURE TO READ YOUR MONTHLY BULLETINS TO MAINTAIN YOUR APPROVAL STATUS. Tuition Assistance—St. James will be utilizing FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment to determine financial need for tuition assistance here at St. James. FACTS provides an online application for families. A family's tax and income information can either be scanned and emailed or sent via mail to the company directly. The deadline for applications for St. James tuition assistance is **April 15, 2017**, for the 2017-2018 school year. If you have applied for aid for a high school and also want to be considered for St. James, you will need to upload your 2016 tax information before the deadline. You do not need to reapply, you just need to update your information. **This is also the process if you applied for the Archdiocesan Financial Aid. Just update your 2016 information before**

April 15th so your results will be sent to us to be considered for parish aid. Complete the application at <https://online.factsmtg.com/signin/3XHJJ>. 2017 Pastoral Council Recommendations

Over the next few weeks, the parish is asking for recommendations for new members of St. James Pastoral Council. The council is a visioning and planning body of parishioners who foster full participation of the parish in the life and mission of the church. In consultation with the pastor, Pastoral Council actively listens to and identifies the needs and concerns of the people and reviews the parish pastoral plan to respond to these needs. The members are selected by a discernment process, which is decision-making rooted in prayer. By using discernment, Fr. Nolker and Pastoral Council acknowledge that God is at work in our lives at all times, especially when making important decisions.

The expectations of council members include:

1. The willingness to consider the needs of the whole parish.
2. The willingness to give the time to prepare for and attend 8-10 meetings per year.
3. The willingness to serve in a consultative capacity.
4. The willingness to listen to and respect the ideas of others.
5. The willingness to work in a spirit of prayer, dialogue, consensus building, and planning.

Recommendations will be accepted until **April 16**. Those identified will be invited to attend an information night on **May 3**. At this meeting, they will learn about the role of the council and will have the opportunity to ask questions. After this evening, those interested will be asked to reflect and pray on this information and discern whether or not he or she feels called to this ministry of service and leadership. The formal discernment night will be held on **May 10** to determine the new council members.

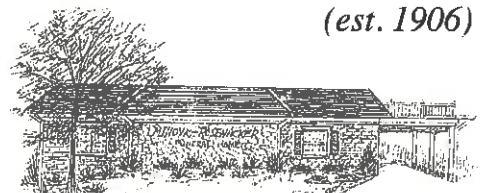
