MARRIAGES – Arrangements should be made through the Parish Office at least six months before any other planning. Pre-Cana Conference, FOCCUS, Engaged Encounter or Equivalent, programs are required.

INFANT BAPTISMS – The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd Sunday of each month at the noon Mass and on the 4th Sunday of each month at 1:30 p.m. (outside of Mass). Parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Program, preferably 2 months prior to the birth of the child. The program is held on the 2nd THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH in the Seniors' Room of the Parish Center at 7:00 p.m. Godparents are also encouraged to attend. Please pre-register by calling the Parish Office. Baptisms will be scheduled after attending the program.

NEW PARISHIONERS – Please register in person at the Parish Office as soon as possible.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS – Please notify the Parish Office if you have had a change of address or phone number, or if a member of your family has gone into a nursing facility or moved out of the household.

BEQUESTS – A bequest to your parish is a way to honor your church and faith of your lifetime. A bequest, included in your will, is exempt from estate and inheritance taxes, and reduces the amount of the estate to be taxed. For more information, please call the Parish Office.

Tour of the Church

Baptismal Font

- 105.** The Baptismal font is the first thing one sees when entering the church. The font is large enough for adult Baptisms at the Easter Vigil.
- 106.** The smaller basin is used as the holy water font when entering the church. The font is trimmed in the same marble and granite as the sanctuary to show the connection between Baptism and Eucharist as Sacraments of Initiation. The arches of the altar are repeated in the font, too. The four sides of the font represent the four Evangelists.

Dear Friends in Christ,

At times throughout our nation's history, certain events take place that animate the public and force us to ask who we are as an American people. As a community of believers in Christ Jesus, who commanded us to build His Kingdom of love on Earth as it exists in Heaven, we are called to turn to our Catholic values in such moments and play an active role in shaping our culture and civic life. We do so tirelessly on such social concerns as abortion, racism, poverty, religious freedom and more.

Events of this past week provided a galvanizing moment for Catholic Social Teaching. I echo my brother bishops, and Pope Francis himself, in condemning the practices of family separation that were taking place at an unprecedented rate on our nation's southern border. The human family is the most fundamental building block of society. The bonds between parents and children are God's gift for how we begin to experience love itself and God's very presence within humanity. In fact, the family is where we first learn to be human. This is a universal truth that applies to families who have U.S. citizenship, those who were born in other places, and even those who have crossed our borders without permission. Governments at any level exist to serve the structure of the family, not the other way around.

These recent events tested our Catholic Social Teaching on the dignity of the human family and each human person. Thank you for your recent prayers and actions in defense of this principle. We still have grave concerns about what happened and what still may take place. But the public outcry, which included the voices of so many of the Catholic faithful, seems to have halted the immediate crisis of the separation of these families. I am grateful for the strong, united witness of our Catholic faith.

Moving forward, I reiterate the call, one which the U.S. Catholic bishops have proclaimed for decades, for a comprehensive reform of our immigration laws. There is undeniably a need for a greater balance among national security, legal means of entry and humane enforcement of our laws. Congress is currently debating legislation now which the U.S. Catholic bishops oppose, as it would further encumber our immigration system rather than improve it. I encourage all the faithful to urge Congress to fix these problems once and for all through a bipartisan effort of fundamental immigration reform. May we continue to respond to God's call to protect human life, dignity and families everywhere.

VIRTUS®—Child Protection—Update

Child Protection Policy—Protecting God’s Children:

New volunteers must attend a VIRTUS workshop and complete the Selection.com background check through your VIRTUS account prior to volunteering or coaching. For details and requirements, please visit our web page, click the Parish Info Tab, then Archdiocese Child Protection Policy. You can call the parish office to check on your status. **If you were previously approved with BCI fingerprints ONLY, and have not completed the Selection.com background check, PLEASE call the parish office to see when they expire. Fingerprints for Volunteers are no longer required, BUT if you were approved with fingerprints ONLY, when they become 5 years old, or by December 31, 2018, EVERYONE will NEED to complete the Selection.com background check through their VIRTUS account (cost is \$25). This is a one-time requirement.** Log into your account, click on the Toolbox tab and the Selection.com background check will be on the left side of the screen. Click and follow the instructions. 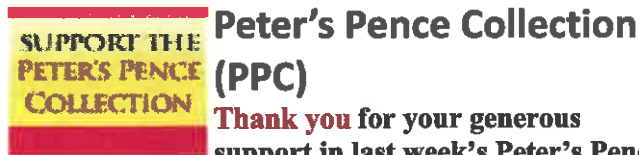

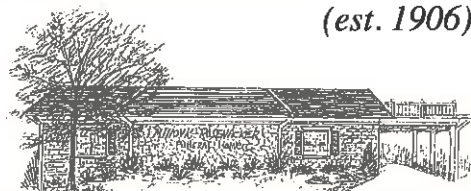
