MARRIAGES – Arrangements should be made through the Parish Office at least six months before any other planning. Pre-Cana Conference, FOCCUS, Engaged Encounter or Equivalent, programs are required.

INFANT BAPTISMS – The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd Sunday of each month at the noon Mass and on the 4th Sunday of each month at 1:30 p.m. (outside of Mass). Parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Program, preferably 2 months prior to the birth of the child. The program is held on the 2nd THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH in the Seniors' Room of the Parish Center at 7:00 p.m. Godparents are also encouraged to attend. Please pre-register by calling the Parish Office. Baptisms will be scheduled after attending the program.

NEW PARISHIONERS – Please register in person at the Parish Office as soon as possible.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS – Please notify the Parish Office if you have had a change of address or phone number, or if a member of your family has gone into a nursing facility or moved out of the household.

BEQUESTS – A bequest to your parish is a way to honor your church and faith of your lifetime. A bequest, included in your will, is exempt from estate and inheritance taxes, and reduces the amount of the estate to be taxed. For more information, please call the Parish Office.

Tour of the Church

Main Entrance

100. A major feature of the main entrance stairwell is the stone tablet from the old church on Cheviot Road. It reads, in German:

Church

Erected Renovated
A.D. 1849 A.D. 1868



101. Next to it is a print of a painting of the 1849 church. The original oil painting hangs in the parish office. It is attributed to Father Francis J. Pabisch who was pastor at Saint James from 1851 to 1856.

102. At the landing of the stairs, there is a picture of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the patroness of all the Americas. On the opposite wall are the bronze plaques commemorating the consecration of the present church on November 7, 1980 by Archbishop Joseph L. Bernardin and the completion of the renovation on May 11, 2013.



Pastor's Desk

Dear friends,

This is the time of the year when we train new ministers for our ministries for Mass. That means some who have been involved ask to be taken off the list of readers or Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion or servers or ushers. Others are new volunteers and need to be added to the schedules. It is a time of transitions.

The number of volunteers for a ministry dictates how we staff a Sunday Mass. For instance, in the last few years, we've only had 2 servers at the Sunday Noon Mass because we don't have sufficient servers willing to minister at Noon to assign the optimum 3 servers. The same thing has now happened at Saturday 4:30 p.m. Mass.

As we put the new schedules together for the Sunday Masses, it has become necessary to make a significant change for the Sunday 12:00 Noon Mass. **Because of a severe lack of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion for that Mass, we will be changing the pattern for receiving Holy Communion beginning July 1. There will be ONE station at the center aisle.** The Host will be distributed in the center and the cups of Precious Blood will be at the two front corners. Everyone in church will need to come to the center aisle to receive.

The Sunday Noon Mass has always been difficult to staff for all the ministries. We do not feel it is appropriate to ask people to minister every Sunday. This is why we have changed the pattern for receiving Holy Communion. Often, the Noon Mass is the smallest congregation of the weekend, and that contributes to the small number of volunteers for the ministries. We are realigning our pattern to fit the realities of that Mass.

Also, there is a need for ushers at the Noon Mass and for 4:30 p.m. on Saturday.

My two major points:

- The pattern for Communion at Sunday Noon Mass changes on July 1.
- Ushers are needed for the Saturday 4:30 p.m. and Sunday Noon Masses. To volunteer, please call the parish office.

VIRTUS®—Child Protection—Update

Child Protection Policy—Protecting God’s Children:

New volunteers must attend a VIRTUS workshop and complete the Selection.com background check through your VIRTUS account prior to volunteering or coaching. For details and requirements, please visit our web page, click the Parish Info Tab, then Archdiocese Child Protection Policy. You can call the parish office to check on your status. **If you were previously approved with BCI fingerprints ONLY, and have not completed the Selection.com background check, PLEASE call the parish office to see when they expire. Fingerprints for Volunteers are no longer required, BUT if you were approved with fingerprints ONLY, when they become 5 years old, or by December 31, 2018, EVERYONE will NEED to complete the Selection.com background check through their VIRTUS account (cost is \$25). This is a one-time requirement.** Log into your account, click on the Toolbox tab and the Selection.com background check will be on the left side of the screen. Click and follow the instructions. **St. James’ next workshop is Tuesday, July 10, 2018 at 6 pm.** See our web page for info, preregistration and additional workshops at other locations.

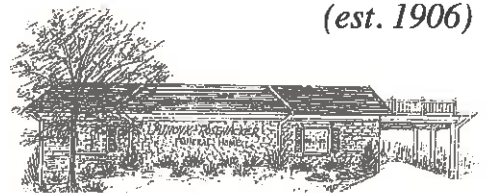
