Parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Program, preferably 2 months prior to the birth of the child. The program is held on the 2nd THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH in the Seniors' Room of the Parish Center at 7:00 pm. Godparents are also encouraged to attend. Please pre-register by calling the Parish Office. Baptisms will be scheduled after attending the program.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS - Please notify the Parish Office if you have had a change of address or phone number, or if a member of your family has gone into a nursing facility or moved out of the household.

As part of our yearlong celebration, interesting facts about St. James Parish will be in the bulletin.

Tour of the Church

The Church Windows

The Saints (West wall opposite the Blessed Sacrament Chapel, from right to left)

152. Saint James the Greater - Saint James is represented by his traditional symbols, the shell (There are three to represent the Trinity.), and the pilgrim staff. The sword references that he was beheaded. In each of the windows in this section there is a red flame symbolizing the flame of faith which inspired these apostles.



Then, there are two small windows of simple colors.

153. St. Paul - The open book symbolizes that St. Paul was an author of letters in the New Testament and a preacher of God's word. The sword has a double meaning. The tradition is that St. Paul was beheaded. In Ephesians 6:17, St. Paul wrote of the "sword of the Spirit which is the word of God." The sword represents both of these.



154. St. Peter - Against the red flame in this window is the upside down cross. Tradition holds that St. Peter was crucified upside down. Superimposed on the cross are the crossed keys that are the traditional symbol of the authority Peter received from Jesus. (cf. Matthew 16:19).



155. Blessed Sacrament Chapel - The primary image in this large round window is the Host above the Chalice of Salvation. Behind it is a red cross with a golden sunburst suggesting the glory of the Sacrament.



156. The Parish Coat of Arms -The parish symbol or coat of arms shows the gold shell of Saint James in the lower portion. The upper portion shows the plow of the Roman farmer Cincinnatus, indicating we are part of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. The two crosses flanking the plow are symbols of our faith that brings us together. The red used indicates that Saint James was a martyr while the glory which is his in heaven is symbolized by the gold.

New volunteers must attend a VIRTUS workshop and complete the Selection.com background check through your VIRTUS account prior to volunteering or coaching. For details and requirements, please visit our web page, click the Parish Info Tab, then Archdiocese Child Protection Policy. You can call the parish office to check on your status. If you were previously approved with BCI fingerprints ONLY, and have not completed the Selection.com background check, PLEASE call the parish office to see when they expire. Fingerprints for Volunteers are no longer required, BUT if you were approved with fingerprints ONLY, when they become 5 years old, or by December 31, 2018, EVERYONE will NEED to complete the Selection.com background check through their VIRTUS account (cost is \$25). This is a one-time requirement. Log into your account, click on the Toolbox tab and the Selection.com background check will be on the left side of the screen. Click and follow the instructions. 
