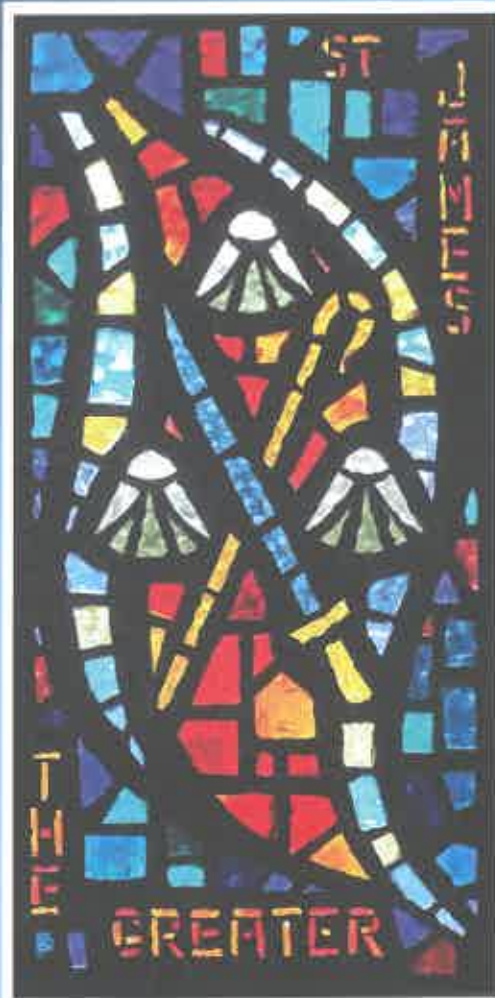

Parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Program, preferably 2 months prior to the birth of the child. The program is held on the 2nd THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH in the Seniors' Room of the Parish Center at 7:00 p.m. Godparents are also encouraged to attend. Please pre-register by calling the Parish Office. Baptisms will be scheduled after attending the program.

**NEW PARISHIONERS** – Please register in person at the Parish Office as soon as possible.

**CHANGE OF ADDRESS** – Please notify the Parish Office if you have had a change of address or phone number, or if a member of your family has gone into a nursing facility or moved out of the household.

## 157. Scouting Groups:



**American Heritage Girls** was founded in 1995 in Cincinnati and has grown into a national organization with over 43,000 members and troops in every state. Troop 1843 began at St. James in 2002 and is chartered by St. James Parish. Girls at all levels of the program (Kindergarten-12th grade) gather at bi-monthly meetings, allowing older AHG members to mentor the younger girls. After the flag ceremony, group prayer and announcements, girls break into Units (by age) to work on badges. AHG Troop 1843 is a Christian, faith-based program, which focuses on service, leadership, friendship, outdoor skills and fun! Our mission is to build women of integrity through service to God, family, community, and country. The Troop serves in our community with the Fill the Bus food drive, HUGS blankets for children in foster care, Matthew 25: Ministries, St. James Fish Fry, Craft Room, Festival Kids' Booth and Donut Sundays. We also "adventure" at least once per month, including outings to a local farm, camping, rock climbing, mother-daughter pottery painting, bowling, zoo overnight, ice skating and a father-daughter dance. AHG Troop 1843 currently has 38 girls participating, along with 10 leaders. Our Troop has grown in the past couple of years and the future looks bright! We look forward to continuing to serve in the St. James Parish Community for years to come.



**Cub Scouts** - St. James Pack 24 was established in 1953. Our mission is to prepare young people to make ethical and moral choices over their lifetime, by instilling the Scout Oath and Law. Cub Scouts are fun for the whole family. Our youths start with their best right-now selves and grow into their very best future selves. Each year, we adventure to new areas and hold to some of our traditions of service projects, our famous Pinewood Derby car races, and celebrating our growth at the end of the year Blue and Gold Banquet. Currently, there are about 60 boys in Cub Scouts.



**Boy Scouts** - St. James Troop 24 was established in 1967. Troop 24 has produced 66 Eagle Scouts since its inception. In Troop 24, we pride ourselves on putting together a topnotch, year-round, boy-run program. Under the guidance of 10 adult advisors, the Troop's junior leaders plan a program with much of the best that Scouting offers, from canoeing the shores of Lake Michigan, to caving in Kentucky, to rock climbing, backpacking and fishing, our Patrol Leaders work together to execute our ambitious schedule. We offer special activities for older boys, like expeditions to Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico (2016) and the Minnesota Boundary Waters (2018).



**Girl Scouts** is a global organization started by Juliette Gordon Lowe in 1912. A combined White Oak/Monfort Heights Troop was started in 1935. St. James School started their own troops in 1955. There are over 120 girls, from kindergarten-8th grade, in individual troops that hold meetings each month. The girls enjoy activities that encourage leadership, and they love to earn badges while exploring new places and new skills. The girls earn religious medals, collected hats and gloves for children in need, and sang Christmas carols to residents at a retirement home. Future plans include volunteering at Matthew 25 Ministries and doing work at The Giving Fields to help grow food for the Freestore Foodbank. The girls enjoy spending time with their fellow St. James Girl Scouts and also meeting new friends during activities with troops throughout the community. Some examples of their outings include: taking an informative tour of Rumpke, going snow tubing, making pumpkins at a local glass-blowing shop, and camping overnight in lodges, tents, and even at the Museum Center. We are proud to have such an active Girl Scout program at St. James and the support we receive from our Parish has allowed our girls *to make the world a better place!*

## 158. Athletics



**The St. James Athletic Club (SJAC)** is our Parish and School's sports organization, serving the children of St. James for over 50 years. SJAC was founded by Fr. Henry Meyer during the Great Depression. The St. James Athletic Club furthers the mission of the Catholic Church by providing sports experiences for youth that are firmly rooted in the Catholic faith tradition. Based on the goals of Catholic youth ministry, the Athletic Club offers the children attending St. James School an opportunity to participate in extracurricular sports activities, while representing our school and its values with their classmates, and rounding out their school experience at St. James. Additionally, we provide a faith-based sports experience for those St. James parishioners attending other local schools. The SJAC offers baseball, basketball, softball, football, cheerleading, soccer, volleyball, and track to boys and girls in St. James Parish. These sports programs are enjoyed by over 600 children annually in grades K-8.

#### **Child Protection Policy—Protecting God's Children:**

**New volunteers must attend a VIRTUS workshop and complete the Selection.com background check through your VIRTUS account prior to volunteering or coaching.** For details and requirements, please visit our web page, click the Parish Info Tab, then Archdiocese Child Protection Policy. You can call the parish office to check on your status. **If you were previously approved with BCI fingerprints ONLY, and have not completed the Selection.com background check, PLEASE call the parish office to see when they expire. Fingerprints for Volunteers are no longer required, BUT if you were approved with fingerprints ONLY when they become 5 years old, or by December 31, 2018, EVERYONE will NEED to complete the Selection.com background check through their VIRTUS account (cost is \$25). This is a one-time requirement. Log into your account, click on the Toolbox tab and the Selection.com background check will be on the left side of the screen. Click and follow the instructions. 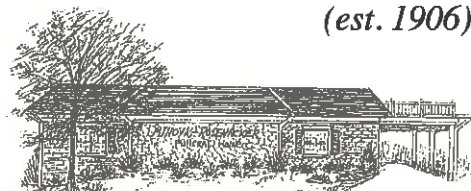
