




As part of our year-long celebration, interesting facts about St. James Parish will be in the bulletin.


Scout Ranch in New Mexico (2016) and the Minnesota Boundary Waters (2018).



Girl Scouts is a global organization started by Juliette Gordon Lowe in 1912. A combined White Oak/Monfort Heights Troop was started in 1935. St. James School started their own troops in 1955. There are over 120 girls, from kindergarten-8th grade, in individual troops that hold meetings each month. The girls enjoy activities that encourage leadership, and they love to earn badges while exploring new places and new skills. The girls earn religious medals,

such as I Live My Faith and the Marian Medal, through the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. The troops have organized food drives, collected hats and gloves for children in need, and sang Christmas carols to residents at a retirement home. Future plans include volunteering at Matthew 25 Ministries and doing work at The Giving Fields to help grow food for the Freestore Foodbank. The girls enjoy spending time with their fellow St. James Girl Scouts and also meeting new friends during activities with troops throughout the community. Some examples of their outings include: taking an informative tour of Rumpke, going snow tubing, making pumpkins at a local glass-blowing shop, and camping overnight in lodges, tents, and even at the Museum Center. We are proud to have such an active Girl Scout program at St. James and the support we receive from our Parish has allowed our girls to make the world a better place!

New Volunteers must attend a VIRTUS workshop and complete the Selection.com background check through your VIRTUS account prior to volunteering or coaching. For details and requirements, please visit our web page, click the Parish Info Tab, then Archdiocese Child Protection Policy. You can call the parish office to check on your status. If you were previously approved with BCI fingerprints ONLY, and have not completed the Selection.com background check, PLEASE call the parish office to see when they expire. Fingerprints for Volunteers are no longer required, BUT if you were approved with fingerprints ONLY when they become 5 years old, or by December 31, 2018, EVERYONE will NEED to complete the Selection.com background check through their VIRTUS account (cost is \$25). This is a one-time requirement. Log into your account, click on the Toolbox tab and the Selection.com background check will be on the left side of the screen. Click and follow the instructions. 


