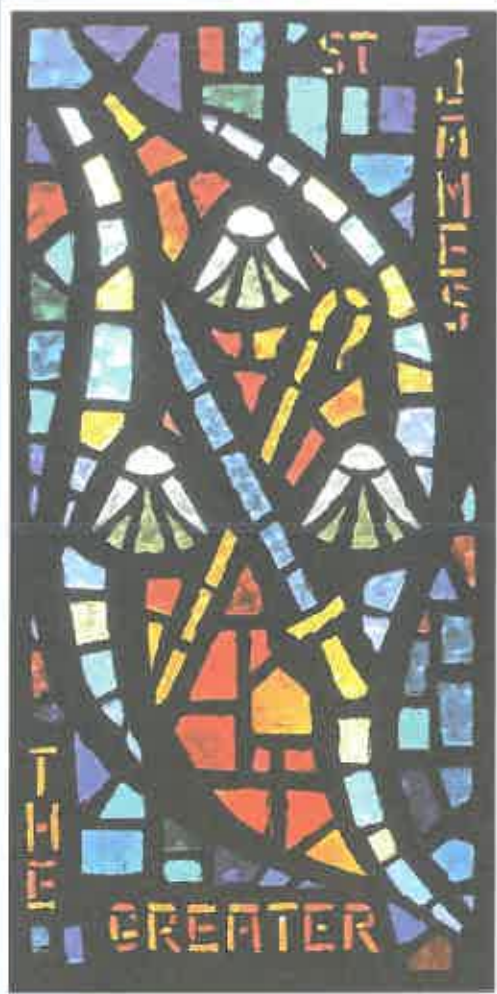

Parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Program, preferably 2 months prior to the birth of the child. The program is held on the 2nd THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH in the Seniors' Room of the Parish Center at 7:00 p.m. Godparents are also encouraged to attend. Please pre-register by calling the Parish Office. Baptisms will be scheduled after attending the program.

NEW PARISHIONERS – Please register in person at the Parish Office as soon as possible.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS – Please notify the Parish Office if you have had a change of address or phone number, or if a member of your family has gone into a nursing facility or moved out of the household.

Reverend Louis J. Abt, Pastor 1931-1946

Reverend Richard Wilhelm, Associate Pastor (the first of many Associate Pastors)

56. Father Louis J. Abt succeeded Father Meyer. According to the history of the parish, he wrote in 1943 for the parish centennial, some of the highpoints of his time at Saint James up to that time were:

- Building interior restrooms in the school in 1931 for \$5,000.00
- Adding another classroom to the school in the basement of the rectory in 1932.
- School and church roofs were repaired in 1933 and fully replaced in 1937.
- In 1938, the statues and stations in the church were repainted and the candlesticks and sanctuary lamps were gold-plated.

- Over the years, walls were washed, new linoieum was put into buildings and two Rex-air sweepers were bought, one for the parish house and the other for the Church and Sisters' residence.

Fasting and Abstinence



Good Friday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat and meat products. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal.

Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards.

Food & Feet on Holy Thursday

At the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday (7:00 pm, March 29), we will again be collecting non-perishable food items for the poor in addition to our monetary collection. Everyone will be invited to come forward to present both the money and food which will go to a local pantry.

We will also have the **Washing of Feet** as part of the Mass that evening. **If you want to participate**, please call the parish office by **Monday, March 26**. You will need to be at Church by 6:30 pm to receive instructions. This is very simple and a great way to participate in a special way in this great Mass.

Speaking of feet, we are also looking for people who are willing to **walk in the procession with the Blessed Sacrament** to the reservation chapel at the end of this Mass. **If you want to participate**, please call the Parish Office by **Monday, March 26**. You will need to be at Church by 6:30 pm to receive instructions.



Pope Francis has asked all parishes to support the **Good Friday Collection for the Holy Land**. Last year's collection supported 29 parishes, 4 homes for orphans and helped keep schools open for 10,000 pre-K through grade 12 students. It supported 120 men preparing to be priest or brothers. It helped rehab 80 home for Christian families and created 1,500 jobs in the Holy Land

for Christians. The wars, unrest and instability have been especially hard on Christians. In these time, this collection provides humanitarian aid to refugees. When you contribute to the Good Friday Collection, you become an instrument of peace in solidarity with the Church in the Holy Land.

The Lord recommended that the hour of His death be honored “for at that moment mercy was opened wide for every soul” (*Diary*, 1572). Jesus determined the appropriate prayers for this 3:00 p.m. devotion: “The Stations of the Cross” or if that is not possible then “immerse yourself in prayer there where you happen to be, if only for a very brief instant” (*Diary*, 1572). Jesus promised, “In this hour you can obtain everything for yourself and for others for the asking; it was the hour of grace for the whole world—mercy triumphed over justice” (*Diary*, 1572). Join us at St. James Church on Divine Mercy Sunday at 3:00 pm for a Holy Hour celebrating

this Feast. Attend Holy Mass on Divine Mercy Sunday *in a state of grace* and receive Holy Communion with great trust in His Mercy and obtain “complete forgiveness of sins and punishment” (*Diary*, 699). VIRTUS®—Child Protection—Update

Child Protection Policy—Protecting God’s Children:

New volunteers must attend a VIRTUS workshop and complete the Selection.com background check through your VIRTUS account prior to volunteering or coaching. For details and requirements, please visit our web page, click the Parish Info Tab, then Archdiocese Child Protection Policy. You can call the parish office to check on your status. **If you were previously approved with BCI fingerprints ONLY, and have not completed the Selection.com background check, PLEASE call the parish office to see when they expire. Fingerprints for Volunteers are no longer required, BUT if you were approved with fingerprints ONLY when they become 5 years old, or by December 31, 2018, EVERYONE will NEED to complete the Selection.com background check through their VIRTUS account (cost is \$25). This is a one-time requirement.** Log into your account, click on the Toolbox tab and the Selection.com background check will be on the left side of the screen. Click and follow the instructions. 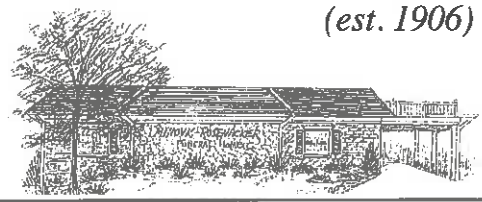
