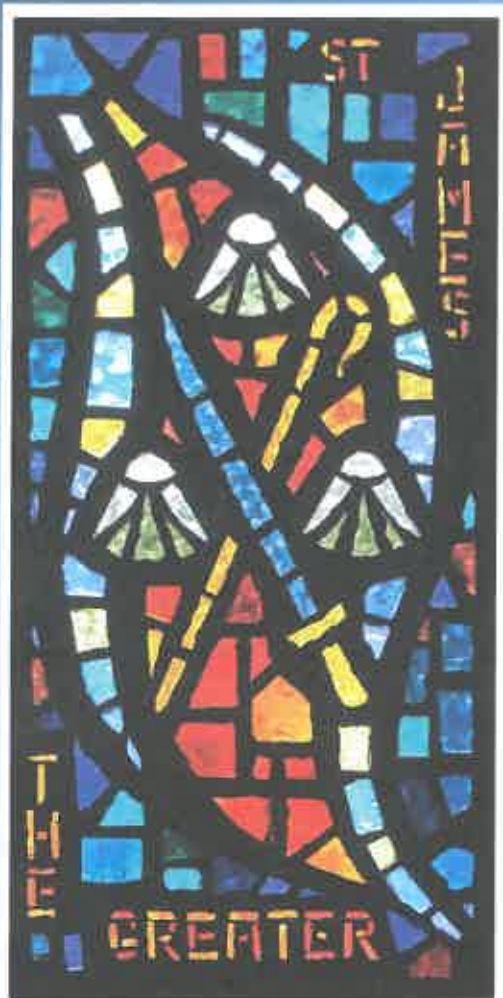
INFANT BAPTISMS – The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd Sunday of each month at the noon Mass and on the 4th Sunday of each month at 1:30 p.m. (outside of Mass). Parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Program, preferably 2 months prior to the birth of the child. The program is held on the 2nd THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH in the Council Room of the Parish Center at 7:00 p.m. Godparents are also encouraged to attend. Please pre-register by calling the Parish Office. Baptisms will be scheduled after attending the program.

NEW PARISHIONERS – Please register in person at the Parish Office as soon as possible.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS OR PARISHIONER STATUS – Please notify the Parish Office if you have had a change of address or phone number, or if a member of your family has gone into a nursing facility or moved out of the household.

BEQUESTS – A bequest to your parish is a way to honor your church and faith of your lifetime. A bequest, included in your will, is exempt from estate and inheritance taxes, and reduces the amount of the estate to be taxed. For more information, please call the Parish Office.

Fasting and Abstinence



Good Friday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat and meat products. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards.

Food & Feet on Holy Thursday

At the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday (7:00 pm, April 18) we will again be collecting non-perishable food items for the poor in addition to our monetary collection. Everyone will be invited to come forward to present both the money and food which will go to a local pantry.

We will also have the **Washing of Feet** as part of the Mass that evening. **If you want to participate**, please call the parish office by **Monday, April 15**. You will need to be at Church by 6:30 pm to receive instructions. This is very simple and a great way to participate in a special way in this great Mass.

Speaking of feet, we are also looking for people who are willing to **walk in the procession with the Blessed Sacrament** to the reservation chapel at the end of this Mass. **If you want to participate**, please call the Parish Office by **Monday April 15**. You will need to be at Church by 6:30 pm to receive instructions.



Good Friday Collection

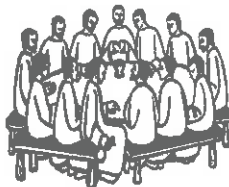

Incense is used at 4:30 p.m., 8:00 and 10:00 a.m.



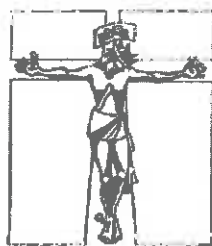
Holy Thursday, April 18

This Mass includes the blessing of the Easter Candle, a vigil service of Scripture readings, blessing of the baptismal font and renewal of baptismal promises of the whole congregation.

Masses 8:00, 10:00 a.m., 12:00 Noon

Incense is used at the 10:00 a.m. and 12:00 Noon Masses.



Come to My Mercy, Three O'clock PM—Hour of Great Mercy

The Lord recommended that the hour of His death be honored “for at that moment mercy was opened wide for every soul” (*Diary*, 1572). Jesus determined the appropriate prayers for this 3:00 p.m. devotion: “The Stations of the Cross” or if that is not possible, then “immerse yourself in prayer there where you happen to be, if only for a very brief instant” (*Diary*, 1572). Jesus promised, “In this hour you can obtain everything for yourself and for others for the asking; it was the hour of grace for the whole world—mercy triumphed over justice” (*Diary*, 1572). **Join us at St. James Church on Divine Mercy Sunday at 3:00 pm for a Holy Hour celebrating this Feast.** Attend Holy Mass on Divine Mercy Sunday in a state of grace and receive Holy Communion with great trust in His Mercy and obtain “complete forgiveness of sins and punishment” (*Diary*, 699).

St. James Parish Tuition Assistance—St. James will be utilizing FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment to determine financial need for tuition assistance here at St. James. FACTS provides an online application for families. A family’s tax and income information can either be scanned and emailed or sent via mail to the company directly. **The deadline for applications for St. James tuition assistance is April 15, 2019, for the 2019-2020 school year.** If you have applied for aid for a high school and also want to be considered for St. James, you will need to upload your 2018 tax information before the deadline. You do not need to reapply; you just need to update your information. This is also the process if you applied for the Archdiocesan Financial Aid. Just update your 2018 information

before April 15th, so your results will be sent to us to be considered for parish aid. The application can be completed at <https://online.factsmgt.com/signin/3XHJJ>.
