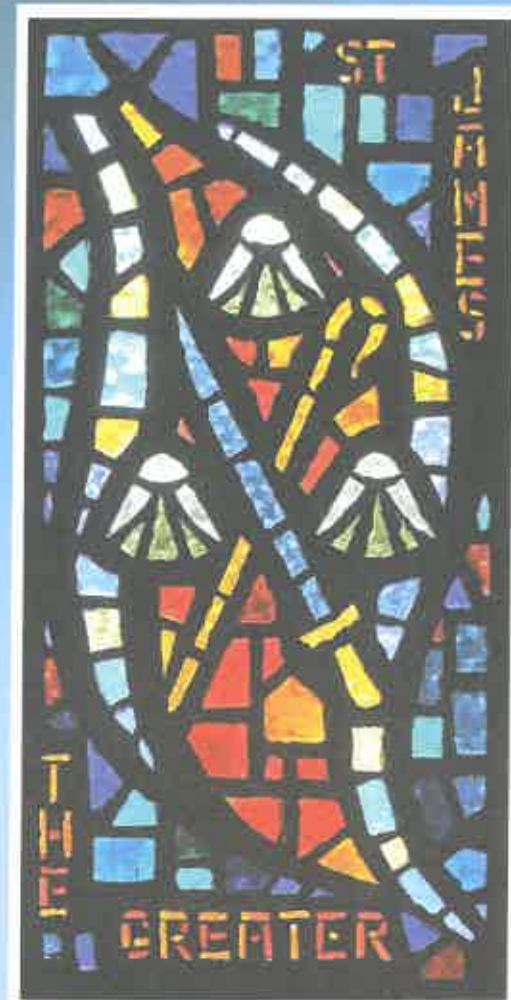

Parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Program, preferably 2 months prior to the birth of the child. The program is held on the 2nd THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH in the Seniors' Room of the Parish Center at 7:00 p.m. Godparents are also encouraged to attend. Please pre-register by calling the Parish Office. Baptisms will be scheduled after attending the program.

**NEW PARISHIONERS** – Please register in person at the Parish Office as soon as possible.

**CHANGE OF ADDRESS** – Please notify the Parish Office if you have had a change of address or phone number, or if a member of your family has gone into a nursing facility or moved out of the household.

## Fasting and Abstinence

**Good Friday** is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat and meat products. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onward.

## Food & Feet on Holy Thursday

At the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday (7:00 pm, April 13) we will again be collecting non-perishable food items for the poor in addition to our monetary collection. Everyone will be invited to come forward to present both the money and food which will go to a local pantry.

We will also have the **Washing of Feet** as part of the Mass that evening. **If you want to participate**, please call the parish office by **Monday, April 10**. You will need to be at Church by 6:30 pm to receive instructions. This is very simple and a great way to participate in a special way in this great Mass.

Speaking of feet, we are also looking for people who are willing to **walk in the procession with the Blessed Sacrament** to the reservation chapel at the end of this Mass. **If you want to participate**, please call the Parish Office by **Monday, April 10**. You will need to be at Church by 6:30 pm to receive instructions.



## HOLY WEEK

Holy Week is not a Passion Play depicting the events of Jesus' Passion, Death and Resurrection. Each day the liturgy focuses on one aspect of the saving mystery unfolded by the events in Christ's life. The unique liturgies of Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday each help us recall the single mystery of our redemption.

On each day, only one liturgy is permitted, so that the whole community can gather together. While we may have other prayer opportunities on these days, nothing is more important for us than celebrating these three liturgies as a full community.

### HOLY THURSDAY—APRIL 13

**7:00 p.m. Mass of the Lord's Supper**

*Incense is used throughout this Mass.*

Lent ends before the Mass begins and the Church begins the three days of the Great Mystery of Salvation, the Paschal Triduum. This Mass commemorates the institution of the Eucharist and the priesthood. Most people recall two unique parts of this liturgy. The first is the washing of feet by the priest as a remembrance of Jesus washing the feet of the disciples (which is the Gospel passage for the Mass) and His call to service of others. The second element is the solemn procession to the reservation chapel with the Blessed Sacrament that will be used for Holy Communion on Good Friday. We are all encouraged to spend some time "keeping vigil" before the Blessed Sacrament this evening. Everyone leaves the church in silence.

### GOOD FRIDAY—APRIL 14

**8:30 a.m. Morning Prayer**

**12:00 Noon Liturgy of the Lord's Passion**

While we begin the day with Morning Prayer from the Liturgy of the Hours, it is prayed as a preparation for the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion. Nothing can replace the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion.

On Good Friday the Church celebrates a unique ritual to recall the Death of the Lord. The solemnity of the Liturgy comes from the realization of the meaning of the Lord's death for us. It is a somber, stark liturgy which begins with the ministers prostrating themselves before the altar for silent prayer. The Liturgy of the Word is highlighted by the reading of the Passion according to Saint John; then follows the General Intercessions, the Veneration of the Cross, and a Communion service. The atmosphere begun on Holy Thursday permeates Good Friday, too, as everyone gathers and leaves in silence.

**Good Friday is a day of abstinence and strict fasting.**

### HOLY SATURDAY—APRIL 15

**9:00 p.m. The Easter Vigil**

*Incense is used throughout this Mass.*

The Easter Vigil is the most beautiful and most important liturgy of the year. The quiet of Holy Saturday is broken when the Church gathers around the Easter fire outside the church building. Here the Paschal Candle is inscribed, blessed and lit. It is the light of the Paschal candle that leads everyone into the darkened church. The Light of Christ dispels the darkness!

After the deacon sings the Easter Proclamation, the Liturgy of the Word follows. Since this is a Vigil, there are more readings from Scripture than usual. With each, the story of our salvation is unfolded until the Gospel proclaims that Jesus is risen from the dead. Then we celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist with adults. The entire congregation renews their baptismal promises, as the congregation will do on Easter Sunday, too.

## Divine Mercy Novena Begins on Good Friday, April 14

Jesus told St. Faustina that the **Feast of the Divine Mercy** is to be preceded by a **Novena to the Divine Mercy**. The Chaplet is an additional powerful prayer. Did you know that Jesus himself dictated the words of the **Chaplet of Divine Mercy** to St. Faustina. He disclosed to her its value and efficacy, as well as the promises He attached to it. In this prayer we are offering "**the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity**" of Jesus Christ to God the Father. We are uniting ourselves with His sacrifice offered on the Cross for the salvation of the world. By offering God the Father His "**most dearly beloved Son**", we are using the most convincing argument with which to be heard. We are asking for mercy "**for us and for the whole world.**" By praying the words of this chaplet we are performing an act of love towards our neighbor. Jesus said, "**Encourage souls to say the Chaplet which I have given you. ...**

**Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death. ... When they say this chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the just Judge but as the Merciful Savior.**" (Diary:687, 1541, 1731). A family's tax and income information can either be scanned and emailed or sent via mail to the company directly. **The deadline for applications for St. James tuition assistance is April 15, 2017**, for the 2017-2018 school year. If you have applied for aid for a high school and also want to be considered for St. James, you need to upload your 2016 tax information before the deadline. You do not need to reapply, just update your information. **This is also the process if you applied for the Archdiocesan Financial Aid. ## 2017 Pastoral Council Recommendations

Over the next few weeks, the parish is asking for recommendations for new members of St. James Pastoral Council. The council is a visioning and planning body of parishioners who foster full participation of the parish in the life and mission of the church. In consultation with the pastor, Pastoral Council actively listens to and identifies the needs and concerns of the people and reviews the parish pastoral plan to respond to these needs.

The members are selected by a discernment process, which is decision-making rooted in prayer. By using discernment, Fr. Nolker and Pastoral Council acknowledge that God is at work in our lives at all times, especially when making important decisions.

### The expectations of council members include:

1. The willingness to consider the needs of the whole parish.
2. The willingness to give the time to prepare for and attend 8-10 meetings per year.
3. The willingness to serve in a consultative capacity.
4. The willingness to listen to and respect the ideas of others.
5. The willingness to work in a spirit of prayer, dialogue, consensus building, and planning.

Recommendations will be accepted until **April 16**. Those identified will be invited to attend an information night on **May 3**. At this meeting, they will learn about the role of the council and will have the opportunity to ask questions. After this evening, those interested will be asked to reflect and pray on this information and discern whether or not he or she feels called to this ministry of service and leadership. The formal discernment night will be held on **May 10** to determine the new council members.

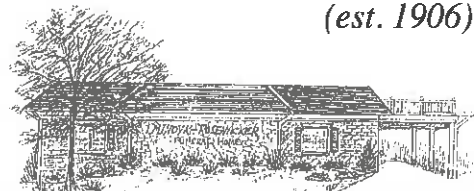
