MARRIAGES – Arrangements should be made through the Parish Office at least six months before any other planning. Pre-Cana Conference, FOCCUS, Engaged Encounter or Equivalent, programs are required.

INFANT BAPTISMS – The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd Sunday of each month at the noon Mass and on the 4th Sunday of each month at 1:30 p.m. (outside of Mass). Parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Program, preferably 2 months prior to the birth of the child. The program is held on the 2nd THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH in the Seniors' Room of the Parish Center at 7:00 p.m. Godparents are also encouraged to attend. Please pre-register by calling the Parish Office. Baptisms will be scheduled after attending the program.

NEW PARISHIONERS – Please register in person at the Parish Office as soon as possible.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS – Please notify the Parish Office if you have had a change of address or phone number, or if a member of your family has gone into a nursing facility or moved out of the household.

BEQUESTS – A bequest to your parish is a way to honor your church and faith of your lifetime. A bequest, included in your will, is exempt from estate and inheritance taxes, and reduces the amount of the estate to be taxed. For more information, please call the Parish Office.

Exterior of the Church

- 98.** On the Hubble Road façade is a stucco relief of the Resurrection. On the east façade (facing the office building) is a figure of Saint James the Greater. Artist Tony Tasset designed the Resurrection for the Hubble Road exterior of the church in 1980. In 1995, he designed the figure of Saint James on the east façade of the church.
- 99.** Above the west entrance hang two of the three bells from the 1849 church. They still ring for Mass and to signal the time of day. The third bell, the smallest, was lost sometime in the 1960s or early 1970s.

VIRTUS®—Child Protection—Update

Child Protection Policy—Protecting God’s Children:

New volunteers must attend a VIRTUS workshop and complete the Selection.com background check through your VIRTUS account prior to volunteering or coaching. For details and requirements, please visit our web page, click the Parish Info Tab, then Archdiocese Child Protection Policy. You can call the parish office to check on your status. **If you were previously approved with BCI fingerprints ONLY, and have not completed the Selection.com background check, PLEASE call the parish office to see when they expire. Fingerprints for Volunteers are no longer required, BUT if you were approved with fingerprints ONLY, when they become 5 years old, or by December 31, 2018, EVERYONE will NEED to complete the Selection.com background check through their VIRTUS account (cost is \$25). This is a one-time requirement.** Log into your account, click on the Toolbox tab and the Selection.com background check will be on the left side of the screen. Click and follow the instructions. St. James’ next workshop is **Tuesday, July 10, 2018 at 6 pm.** See our web page for info, pre-registration and additional workshops at other locations.

MISSIONARY SUNDAY

June 9th and 10th

TODAY at all Masses, Rev. Raju Pilla will be speaking about the works and the needs of the Latin Archdiocese of Trivandrum in India. Trivandrum has



about 270,000 Catholics. 90% of the people are traditional fishermen who depend on fishing for their livelihood and 10% are farm workers who are recent converts from low caste Hindus. "Harvest is plentiful but Laborers are few!" Unemployment and poverty are most rampant in this community. The Archdiocese depends on outside assistance to support its clergy, seminarians, Catechists and to continue its developmental programs for the Community. Several coastal villages of the Archdiocese were hit by "Ockhi" Cyclone on November 30, 2017. More than 289 young fishermen lost their life while doing deep sea fishing. There is so much sadness and devastation in their villages. Many young Catholic families lost their men and everything they had. We are looking for emergency assistance to help the children especially, with food, and housing. Won't you be as generous as you can in the second collection? Your sacrifice for the Missions is very much appreciated and may God Bless You!

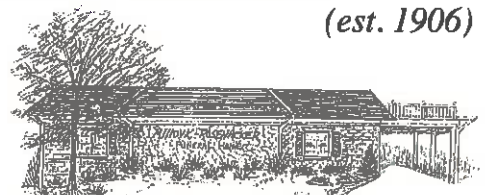
