CHANGE OF ADDRESS – Please notify the Parish Office if you have had a change of address or phone number, or if a member of your family has gone into a nursing facility or moved out of the household.

Baptism

- 145.** The dove represents the Holy Spirit; the shell is a symbol of Baptism. The Chi Rho symbolizes Christ and the hand, God the Father. The snake and apple are symbols of original sin taken from the Book of Genesis. The color blue symbolizes water and is found in all of the sacramental windows, indicating that it is Baptism that opens to us all the other sacraments.



Confirmation

- 146.** The red tongues of fire are the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, which is symbolized by the dove. The sword and shield symbolize the strength received to live Christian lives.

The Sacrament of The Anointing of the Sick Sunday, October 13 & 14

On this weekend, we will again offer the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick at all the Masses.

Who should be anointed?

✠ Anyone who has a serious illness or the debilitation of old age.

When should they be anointed?

✠ As soon as the illness is diagnosed and anytime it significantly worsens. Anointing is the sacrament which helps us cope with illness and helps us to heal.

How long do the effects of the sacrament last?

✠ There is no "expiration date" for the sacrament.

Isn't this sacrament supposed to be given when somebody is dying?

✠ The ritual book for the Sacrament of Anointing says, "The reception of the Eucharist as viaticum, food for the passage through death to eternal life, is the sacrament proper to the dying Christian... *The sacrament of anointing should be celebrated at the beginning of a serious illness.*" {#175} The sacrament for the dying is Holy Communion. This doesn't mean that a dying person can't be anointed, but the anointing should happen long before that moment. It should never be the case that receiving the Anointing of the Sick is put off until the person is dying.

Also, remember that a priest may not be available when someone is dying.

New volunteers must attend a VIRTUS workshop and complete the Selection.com background check through your VIRTUS account prior to volunteering or coaching. For details and requirements, please visit our web page, click the Parish Info Tab, then Archdiocese Child Protection Policy. You can call the parish office to check on your status. **If you were previously approved with BCI fingerprints ONLY, and have not completed the Selection.com background check, PLEASE call the parish office to see when they expire. Fingerprints for Volunteers are no longer required, BUT if you were approved with fingerprints ONLY, when they become 5 years old, or by December 31, 2018, EVERYONE will NEED to complete the Selection.com background check through their VIRTUS account (cost is \$25). This is a one-time requirement.** Log into your account, click on the Toolbox tab and the Selection.com background check will be on the left side of the screen. Click and follow the instructions. 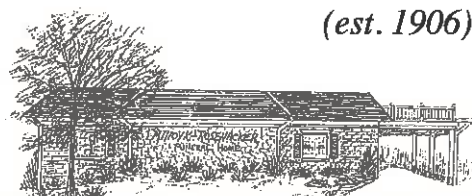
