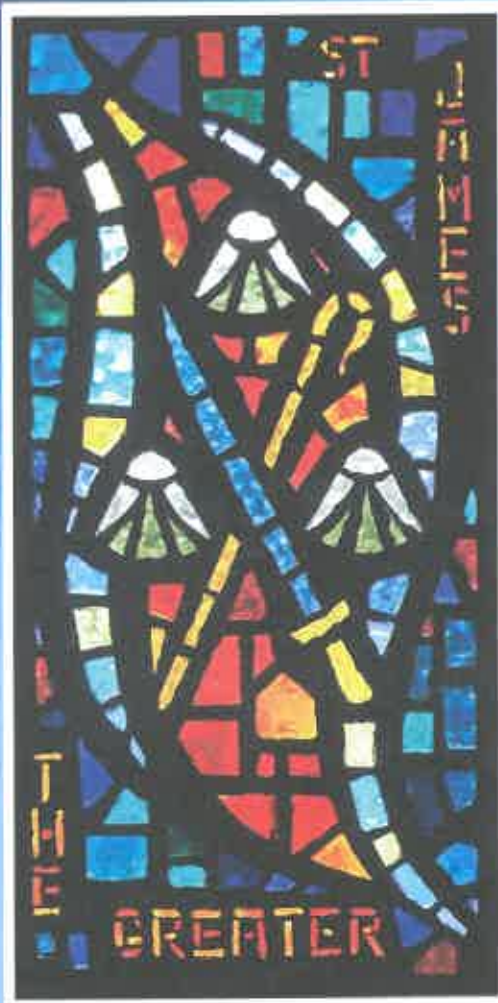
INFANT BAPTISMS – The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd Sunday of each month at the noon Mass and on the 4th Sunday of each month at 1:30 p.m. (outside of Mass). Parents are required to attend a Baptismal Preparation Program, preferably 2 months prior to the birth of the child. The program is held on the 2nd THURSDAY OF EACH MONTH in the Seniors' Room of the Parish Center at 7:00 p.m. Godparents are also encouraged to attend. Please pre-register by calling the Parish Office. Baptisms will be scheduled after attending the program.

NEW PARISHIONERS – Please register in person at the Parish Office as soon as possible.

CHANGE OF ADDRESS – Please notify the Parish Office if you have had a change of address or phone number, or if a member of your family has gone into a nursing facility or moved out of the household.

BEQUESTS – A bequest to your parish is a way to honor your church and faith of your lifetime. A bequest, included in your will, is exempt from estate and inheritance taxes, and reduces the amount of the estate to be taxed. For more information, please call the Parish Office.

St. James White Oak 175th Anniversary 1843 - 2018—Spreading the Word



As part of our year-long celebration, interesting facts about St. James Parish will be in the bulletin.



For the next few bulletins, we will spotlight some of our parish groups.

Social Outreach Ministries



159. Cookie Connection provides cookies and juice, along with sandwiches donated by other local churches, for needy and homeless of the inner city. The cookies and drinks are delivered to St. Francis Seraph Church, which is located downtown on Liberty Street. These items, along with sandwiches from two other parishes, are used to make lunches that are passed out to the needy. The needy have been day workers, preschoolers, the homeless and other individuals in the “Over the Rhine” neighborhood. The volunteers at St. Francis take care of the distribution. This ministry was started approximately 10-12 years ago by parishioners, after the parishes donating the sandwiches were featured in an article in the Enquirer.



160. Giving Tree was started in the late 60’s or early 70’s by parishioners who volunteered at St. Francis de Sales School and realized that the students were not getting anything for Christmas. Last year, 1,135 gifts were distributed to St. Francis de Sales School, Oyler School, Our Lady of the Woods, St. James St. Vincent de Paul, Pregnancy Center West, First Step Home, St. James Parish families, and to the Glenmary Missions in Frenchburg, KY and Pemiscot, MO. The generosity of St. James parishioners is overwhelming!



161. St. Vincent de Paul - The St. James St. Vincent de Paul Conference was founded on May 31, 1961. Associate Pastor Fr. Thomas Axe was one of the founding members. From July 1, 2017 to June 30, 2018, 227 people in the St. James geographic area were helped with rent, utilities and food. This includes all family members helped by either home visits or telephone contacts. It also includes 16 families helped by the St. James Christmas Giving Tree Program. There currently are eight members in our group.



162. Yarns and Cards was previously known as Scarves for the Homeless. We meet monthly to make crocheted and knitted items and to play cards. Items are donated to the St. James Festival - two baskets each year. We also donate to inner-city schools, nursing homes, and Our Lady of the Woods. We make hats, scarves, and blankets, and buy gloves. We have around 15 people in this group.

Child Protection Policy—Protecting God's Children:

New volunteers must attend a VIRTUS workshop and complete the Selection.com background check through your VIRTUS account prior to volunteering or coaching. For details and requirements, please visit our web page, click the Parish Info Tab, then Archdiocese Child Protection Policy. You can call the parish office to check on your status. **If you were previously approved with BCI fingerprints ONLY, and have not completed the Selection.com background check, PLEASE call the parish office to see when they expire. Fingerprints for Volunteers are no longer required, BUT if you were approved with fingerprints ONLY, when they become 5 years old, or by December 31, 2018, EVERYONE will NEED to complete the Selection.com background check through their VIRTUS account (cost is \$25). This is a one-time requirement.** Log into your account, click on the Toolbox tab and the Selection.com background check will be on the left side of the screen. Click and follow the instructions. St. James' next workshop is **Thursday, November 15, 2018 at 6 pm. Our next one here will be in February.** See our web page for info, preregistration and additional workshops at other locations.

End of Year Charitable Donations

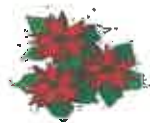
BLOOD DONORS SAVE LIVES—

Our Lady of Guadalupe – Patroness of the Americas and the Pro-Life Movement



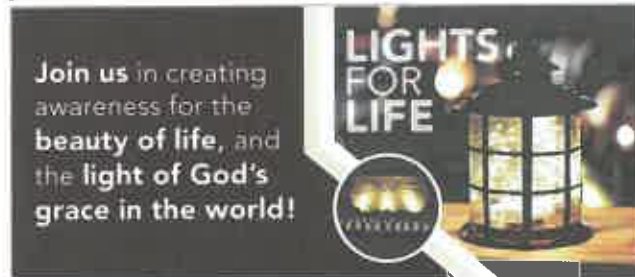

Dear Parishioners:

The U.S. bishops are joining together in a commitment of prayer and reparation leading up to the bishops' general assembly, where we will be making critical decisions in response to the clergy sexual abuse crisis. With our brother bishops across the nation, we will be dedicating ourselves to seven days of intensified prayer and fasting, from Monday, November 5, through Sunday, November 11. The intentions for this period of prayer and sacrifice are three-fold:

For the healing and support of all victims of clergy sexual abuse.

For the conversion and just punishment of the perpetrators and concealers of sexual abuse.

For the strength of the bishops to be holy shepherds in protecting and leading our sheep from all harm.

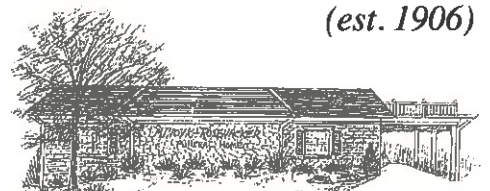
