

### Calling Them Holy

We all know that there are more saints in heaven than those who are officially recognized by the Church. There are stages in the path to being recognized as a saint. Someone being considered for canonization moves from being a *Servant of God*, to being a *Venerable*, to being called a *Blessed*. A miracle is usually needed for the person to reach being a *Blessed* and another is needed for the person to be given the title *Saint*. While we talk about a person being made a saint, we must remember that the person doesn't become a saint because the Church has done something. The person is already a saint by the way he or she lived; they achieved sainthood before they died. The Church is only recognizing what is already a reality – the person was holy. That's why heaven is full of saints whose names we don't know.

In the next few months two Americans will be declared "Blessed" at ceremonies in our country. Only once before has that ceremony happened in the U.S. That was in 2014 when Sister Miriam Demjanovich was beatified in a ceremony in Newark, N.J.

**Father Stanley Rother, the Oklahoma-born martyr who served as a priest in Guatemala, will be declared Blessed in Oklahoma City on Sept. 23.** Over the years, the violence of the Guatemalan civil war came closer to the village where he ministered. Disappearances, killings and danger soon became a part of daily life, but Father Rother remained steadfast and supportive of his people. Although he returned home for a brief period, Father Rother knew he had to return to his people. Father Rother was just 46 years old when he was shot to death in his rectory in the early morning hours — one of 10 priests killed in Guatemala in 1981. He had known for several months that the death squads were targeting him. The Holy Father has declared Father Rother a martyr for the faith which means a miracle was not needed for him to be beatified.



**The second beatification will happen in Detroit. Fr. Solanus Casey was born in Oak Grove, Wisconsin, in 1870; for most of his adult life, he ministered to the people of Detroit – helping the poor, the sick, those in need of advice and comfort.** He was the porter or doorkeeper at his Capuchin Monastery and for many in need, his was the face that would greet them when they came to the monastery seeking assistance. The required miracle for his beatification happened to a woman who suffered from an incurable genetic skin disease. While visiting friends in Detroit, she decided to visit Fr. Solanus' tomb to pray for the intentions of people who had asked her to pray for them. After her prayers for them, she prayed for herself, as well. Reluctantly, she added her own needs to the list of favors requested; she received an instantaneous and visible healing. Doctors in Detroit, in Rome, and in her home country have studied the case, and all agree that the healing has no scientific explanation and is, therefore, miraculous. The Holy Father has approved his beatification for later this year. No date has been announced.

I will end with a question for you to research. Pope Benedict XVI reinstated the practice of having a cardinal celebrate the beatification in the home diocese of the person rather than have the pope do it in Rome. The pope does celebrate the Mass for declaring persons a *Saint*. It is very unusual for that ceremony to be held outside Rome. Has the Holy Father ever celebrated a Mass in the United States in which he has declared someone a *Saint*?
