Background: Mass Intentions and Stipends

Unfortunately, one of the most common phrases associated with Mass intentions is totally heretical: "I'd like to buy a Mass." Where that phrase came from, I don't know but it sure is popular.

Beginning in the early Middle Ages, when people asked a priest to remember a specific concern or person at Mass, they would give the priest a sacrificial offering. This was the money the priest used to buy food, housing, etc. I suppose it started as a token of appreciation. With time, the amount wasn't left up to the donor's discretion but fee schedules were established. From what I can find out, the suggested stipends haven't changed since the 1800s when \$5 was a lot of money. Using old church language, the silent *low Mass* cost \$2; the *high Mass* required music and cost \$5. A *solemn High Mass* with priest, deacon and subdeacon and all the bells 'n smells cost \$25. All of it was spelled out as clearly as prices in the grocery store. I bet that's where "I'd like to buy a Mass" started. Now that the difference between *low Mass* and *high Mass* doesn't exist anymore, the standard stipend is \$5 in our archdiocese. (Some dioceses have increased it to \$10.)

The stipend system led to abuses. Priests took multiple stipends to remember more than one intention per Mass. It was like double-booking and was clearly intended to increase the priest's income. This was also what led to the abuse where a priest would agree to "say" many Masses a day, a practice the Council of Trent stopped. Canon Law also forbids priests from taking more than one stipend per Mass; it doesn't limit the number of intentions, just stipends. Today, priests have a regular salary and the monetary Mass stipend goes to the parish.

Especially in our consumer mentality, the phrase *buying a Mass* also turns into ownership: "If I paid for it, it's mine." This gives the idea that all the grace from a particular celebration of the Mass will be applied only to the intention indicated by the donor. This is especially true in people's minds when the Mass intention is for a deceased individual. It is necessary to remember that the intention for which a donor gave a stipend is a private intention of the priest. And it isn't necessarily his only intention. Everybody at Mass that has an intention and they are all equal in the sight of God. The Mass is about grace and prayer. The Church teaches that there is unlimited grace flowing from every celebration of the Lord's Death and Resurrection and it is shared according to God's will.

I know that some priests say, "This Mass is being offered for..." This unfortunately gives the idea that all the grace from this celebration of the Mysteries is applied only to this intention; that is wrong. It gives the idea that it is the only intention; that is wrong. It gives the idea that everybody at that Mass is praying for that intention; that is wrong.

Talking about Mass intentions, it is important to also recall that the priest's intention for one Mass each Sunday and Holy Day must be "For the people of the parish."

Requesting a Mass intention is asking the priest to personally remember that intention as he presides. It's like asking a friend to pray for your concern. That's the simple explanation.

Policy Regarding Mass Intentions

With one less priest at the parish, the number of Masses is cut in half. That means the opportunities for intentions is cut in half. It is not unusual for someone to stop in the office requesting 10 intentions for various deceased loved ones during the coming year. If that request was granted, this person would cover all the Mass intentions for two weeks. Obviously, this is not fair to other parishioners. The many concerns related to the issue of Mass intentions has caused us to write a policy about the acceptance and scheduling of Mass intentions. Our intent is to be fair to all our parishioners.

Mass Intention Policies Saint James the Greater

Effective August 1, 2019

The practice of requesting a Mass to be offered for loved ones, living or deceased, is a beautiful and meaningful part of our Catholic tradition. In our Catholic Parish, there are many requests for scheduling such Mass intentions. St. James Parish has only a certain amount of Mass intention opportunities. The following policies are being implemented in order to accommodate the numerous requests in a reasonable and fair manner.

Please note the following guidelines for Mass intention requests:

1. To insure consistent and fair opportunity for all desiring an intention for a loved one or event, we can schedule no more than 3 (three) Masses per year from each donor or for an intention.
2. Additional Masses may be requested; however, they may be sent out of the parish to the Chancery or Mission Office for distribution to other priests who will be able to celebrate these Masses. This applies to Mass intentions received at the time of a funeral.

Canon Law does not permit us to keep Mass intentions beyond those that we are able to schedule in a year's time (rolling calendar). Consequently, some intentions may have to be sent to the Chancery or Mission Office for distribution to other priests who will be able to celebrate these Masses.

3. Masses may only be scheduled 12 months in advance from date of request.
4. Requests will be honored on a first-come, first-serve basis in the order in which the request is received at the Parish Office.
5. Mass requests will be granted as close to the requested date and time as possible. If it is not possible to comply with the primary request, the next closest date and time will be scheduled.
6. As a Parish we will make every effort to accommodate a Mass within 30 days of the passing of a loved one, and on or near the first anniversary of a person's death. One Mass time each week will be kept open so that the recently deceased can be remembered soon after their death.
7. No Mass request will be taken over the telephone at the Parish Office. Requests for Mass intentions may be requested in person in the Parish Office or by mail. A \$5 stipend, as determined by diocesan policy, is to accompany each Mass request before it can be recorded in the Mass Intention Book.
8. Mass intentions may be requested for Sundays, most holidays and weekdays throughout the year.
9. One Mass every Sunday must be scheduled for the intentions of our parishioners known as "Pro Populo" (For the People) as required by Canon Law and diocesan statute. In addition, twice a month a Mass time will be reserved for the intention of the celebrant.
10. **SPECIAL DAYS:** Mass intentions cannot be scheduled for:
 - Holy Thursday, Easter, Christmas when the intentions are all "Pro Populo";
 - Mothers' Day when the intentions will be "all mothers of the parish, living and deceased";
 - Father's Day when the intention will be "all fathers of the parish, living and deceased";
 - All Souls' Day (November 2) when the intention will be "All the faithful departed."
11. If for an unforeseen circumstance a Mass cancellation occurs, the intention for the Mass will be rescheduled on the next available opening.

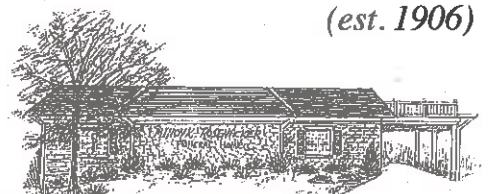
