Taking Communion to Someone Not Able to Be with Us at Mass

In order to safeguard the respect for Our Lord Jesus Christ who is truly present in the Eucharist, we ask that if you are taking Holy Communion to someone at home or visiting someone after Mass that you follow these simple guidelines: use only a pyx to carry the host. Pyxes are available to borrow in the Hubble Road Sacristy. It is preferred that you do not come up in line at Communion time and request host(s) to be distributed later, rather, proceed to the Blessed Sacrament Chapel immediately after Mass and a Coordinator will be there to assist in retrieving host(s) from the tabernacle. This way you can go directly to visit the person/people without having Our Lord in a purse or pocket. We earnestly desire to assist you in your ministry of taking Holy Communion to those unable to be with us at Mass, **and** to ensure the ultimate in respect to Our Lord in the Eucharist. Thank you for understanding.

Active Parishioner Status Info

We receive many requests from parishioners to qualify for weddings here, or to be godparents or sponsors for the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. Part of that request is to be able to verify that a person is an "active member" of St. James the Greater Parish. An "active member" of this parish is one who: **1.** Is properly registered and on the parish census. **2.** Faithfully attends Mass on Sundays and Holy Days. **3.** Participates in parish activities when possible. **4.** Uses the parish envelope system.

NOTE: An adult child living at home should register as themselves or please notify the Parish Office when they no longer live at home with the parents.

While assessments of an inquirer's status will be made individually, the above are the main factors that will be considered in making that determination. **If you would like to update your information and/or inquire about your membership status, or if you do not receive our Quarterly Parish Life Newsletter or yearly Sunday contribution envelopes, you are inactive in our parish database. Sr. Dorothy Stang Award

St. James Parish is pleased to acknowledge Larry and Luanne Gibboney as this year's recipients of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati Sr. Dorothy Stang Award for our parish. The award, which used to be archdiocese-wide, is now celebrated in each parish. Nominees who demonstrate a missionary spirit to the poor and marginalized, locally, nationally, or across borders are eligible. Sr. Dorothy Stang was born in Dayton, Ohio and was member of the Congregation of the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur. She was murdered in Anapu, a city in the state of Pará, in the Amazon Basin of Brazil. Stang had been outspoken in her efforts on behalf of the poor and the environment, and had previously received death threats from loggers and land owners. Her cause for canonization as a martyr and model of sanctity is underway within the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. Her tireless efforts won her international acclaim as she championed the rights of the poor and the protection of the land they called home.

Larry and Luanne Gibboney have participated and promoted outreach efforts over the past 30+ years in multiple areas. Working with Little Brothers Friends of the Elderly, they both regularly care for the aged and lonely elderly by organizing campaigns to secure food and distribute Thanksgiving dinners and Christmas packages, as well as, during other times of the year. They motivate others in the parish to assist in these ventures.

Larry is a member of a large men's spiritual group known as FATHERS, which operates out of St. James. He has taken the lead to acquire and warehouse nonperishable food and consumable supplies for the groups' bi-monthly service to the Queen City Soup Kitchen in Walnut Hills. Larry arranges his work and leisure time so as not to miss these scheduled dates. When supplies run low, the Gibboneys provide what is needed out of their own pocket. Both Larry and Luanne are unassuming people who lead by example. They demonstrate what it means to be a disciple of Christ by humble caring for their neighbor, regardless of race, creed, or origin and encourage others to do so.

Most recently, the Gibboneys have begun to support C.A.I.N. (Churches Active in Northside). This group is supported by thirteen member Churches including St. Clare, St. Boniface and St. Saviour Catholic Churches and provides a food pantry, shelter homes and outreach to persons in need in Northside and College Hill. Larry and Luanne are currently assisting in serving dinners to the C.A.I.N. clients.

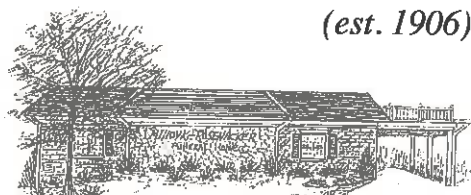
