**SAFE PARISH**

SafeParish – the new Child Protection Platform for the AoC.

All new volunteers and employees should follow the SafeParish registration instructions for creating a SafeParish account. During the registration process, new volunteers and employees will be invited to complete their online background check and their child protection training online. New employees will also need to complete manual fingerprinting and submit a B4 form for approval.

**Weekly Emails:** Each Tuesday SafeParish sends an email regarding the updated child protection and workplace safety articles that are posted on the SafeParish website. These articles are NOT required but are recommended reading.

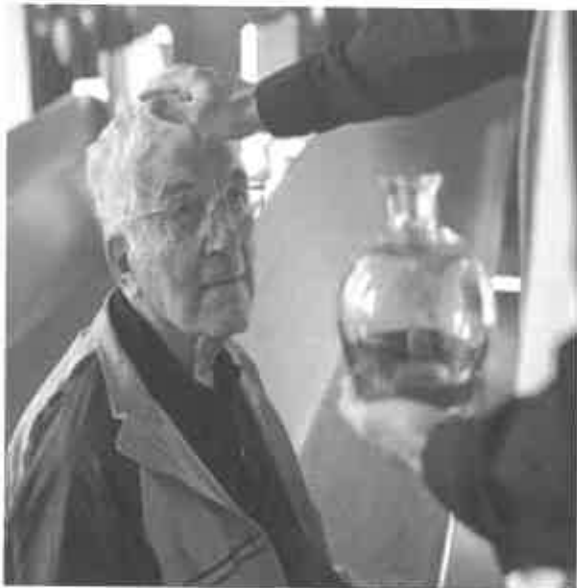
**Quarterly Bulletins:** The 3rd Quarter bulletin was issued on September 10th and all users should have received an email assigning the bulletin. If they did not receive an email, please have them log into their SafeParish account and then go to Training > Due to see the link for the 3rd Quarter bulletin.

Users who created a SafeParish account after September 10, will not be assigned the 3rd Quarter bulletin and will not receive a bulletin until the 4th Quarter bulletin is issued. This includes users who have duplicate accounts. If the user with duplicate accounts created an account prior to September 10 then that account will receive the 3rd Quarter bulletin. If the duplicate account was created after September 10th, then the duplicate account will not be assigned the 3rd Quarter bulletin and will not be assigned a bulletin until the 4th Quarter bulletin is issued.

### The Anointing of the Sick

#### 4:30 p.m. Vigil Mass

#### 8:00 & 10:00 a.m. Masses

Anyone who has a **serious or chronic illness** should receive this Sacrament. It can be repeated if the illness continues and especially if it worsens.

The Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick should never be postponed until a person is dying.

The Sacrament should be received at the beginning of a serious sickness to pray for healing.

One of the prayers in the ritual says,

*Lord Jesus Christ, our Redeemer,  
by the grace of Your Holy Spirit,  
cure the weakness of Your servants.  
Heal their sickness and forgive their sins;  
mercifully restore them to full health,  
and enable them to resume their former duties,  
for You are Lord for ever and ever.*

The Church teaches that the Sacrament should be received by those who are suffering the debilitation of old age. (This is how the ritual describes it.) We aren't to be anointed simply because we hit a certain age. But when we begin to physically or mentally fail in a serious way, anointing is appropriate.

The Sacrament should NOT be received as a preventative for Covid.

At Mass:

Those who wish to be anointed will be called forward after the homily.

Father will come to those who need to stay in their pew. (Please try to sit in the front pews if you will not be coming forward.)

After a person is anointed, he/she returns to the pew.

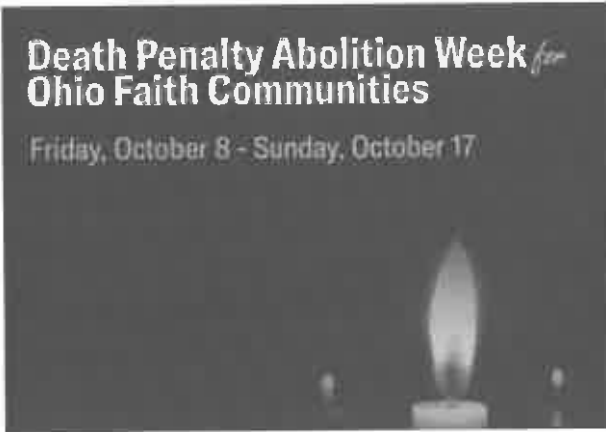
**Respect Life Sunday Collection**

For 45 years, the Hyde amendment and similar laws have protected taxpayers from being forced to pay for elective abortions.

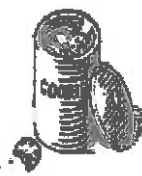
