Fasting and Abstinence



Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence from meat and meat products. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may also be taken, but not to equal a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards.



Our Music in Lent

The starkness in our prayer and the somber tone in our music helps us to enter into a deeper communion with the Lord. Our Introductory Ritual will begin with the congregation standing and facing the shrine area where the relic of the True Cross is. As the procession moves to the sanctuary, we will sing the hymn "From Ashes to the Living Font" each Sunday. The first verse reminds us of our Baptism and our lifelong need of the Lord renewing us in His grace. The third verse of the hymn will relate to the Gospel of the respective Sunday. The fourth verse speaks of our journey "through cross and tomb to Easter joy, in Spirit-fire fulfilled."

Our musical accompaniment of the organ and piano will be much simpler than that of Ordinary Time. The Penitential Act will be sung a cappella. The hymns and the Eucharistic Acclamations will start with a simple organ/piano line, just enough to get us ready to sing the respective hymn. The Universal Prayer will have a sung response, "Listen, Lord, and answer me." The recessional hymn will again be a simple refrain, such as "Mercy, O God, have mercy on us" or "Jesus Christ, yesterday, today, and for ever."

Naturalization Ceremony



On Friday, February 28, 2020 at 11:00 a.m. St. James will have the privilege of hosting a Naturalization Ceremony for individuals who will become new American citizens. This is our 20th year to sponsor this momentous occasion. On this day the Church Hall will become an official court of law presided over by Magistrate Judge Karen L. Litkovitz, who will administer the oath of citizenship.

Typically we have up to 100 candidates for citizenship from countries all over the world.

St. James students have the opportunity to participate in the ceremony in a number of ways. The children's choir may open the ceremony. St. James Scouting groups may help direct the morning's traffic and post the American flag. 7th and 8th grade students may have the honor of attending the ceremony and may also provide community service hours by helping with the morning refreshments, child care, cleaning up, making the country of origin flags and congratulatory cards for the new citizens.

It is inspirational to hear each applicant stand and state their name and country of origin before declaring their Oath of Allegiance to the United States. They make the promise to "support and defend the Constitution and laws of the United States." Finally, they face the United States flag and recite the Pledge of Allegiance for the first time as United States citizens. We are proud to show our support to the wider community in which we live. 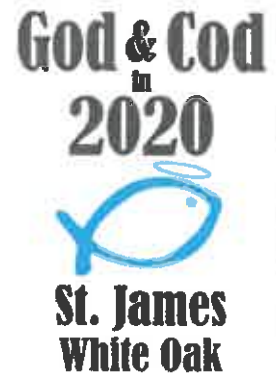

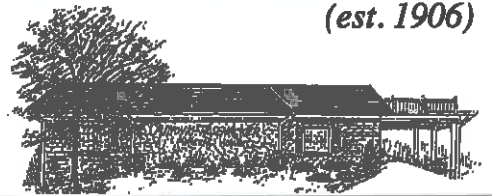
