

April 6, 2020 ... UPDATES...

THE BISHOPS OF OHIO HAVE EXTENDED THE SUSPENSION OF PUBLIC MASSES UNTIL AND INCLUDING MAY 3.

We continue our physical separation out of charity for all people. The absence of public Masses has been very difficult; it is much like the suffering of the Lord in the Garden. The uncertainty of the weeks ahead increases our anxiety. So, we continue to pray together, our greatest weapon in this time. Don't forget the *Memorare* at Noon every day.

The parish and school offices remain closed. The cancellation of <u>all</u> parish events also continues until further notice. The church is normally open Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 12 Noon for private prayer. On Good Friday the church will remain open until 5:00 p.m. Confessions will <u>not</u> be heard on Holy Saturday.

The sad news is that as of April 6 we have furloughed all our non-contract employees. Some have been reduced 100% in their hours and others have been partially reduced because they are still providing some essential services. We have been told by the archdiocese officials all are eligible for unemployment with the COVID-19 benefits approved by the federal government. All will retain their health care benefits, etc. These people are not terminated; they will return to their jobs when the school and parish reopen.

We have entered the holiest week of the year. By now all of us would have begun the journey into the Great Mystery. This year we will find deep emptiness as we cannot celebrate in person the Mass of the Lord' Supper, the Liturgy of the Passion and Death of Jesus, the Easter Vigil (with the baptism of adults) or Easter Sunday Mass. I anticipate we all will feel like we have missed the most important events of the year, and we will. That doesn't mean we cannot pray. This is why I have listed various ways for you to participate in the Holy Week and Easter liturgies. It may expand our understanding of the rites to see them in a venue we haven't experienced. As often as I have been to St. Meinrad Archabbey for retreat, I've never had the opportunity to join the monks for Holy Week. I think I will this year. If you haven't been to our cathedral for Holy Week, begin with the Chrism Mass on Tuesday afternoon and continue all week. However you choose to do so, be sure to join in the Holy Week liturgies.
